

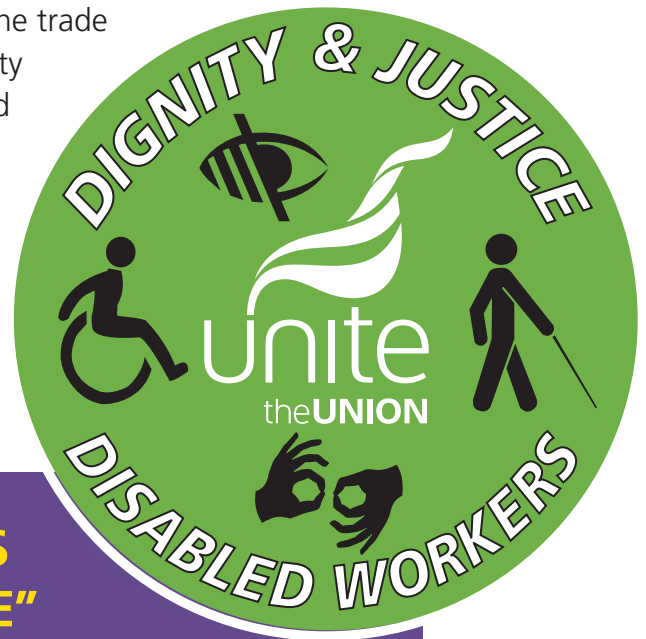
DISABILITY HISTORY MONTH
